IB Mission Statement



IB Learner Profile

As stated in the JM Mission Statement, the school aims to develop the academic, moral, social, and civic values of its learners, ultimately resulting in internationally minded people who make the world a better place. In order to accomplish the IB mission statement, the learner strives to acquire ten attributes to help him/her not only develop academic skills such as critical and analytical thinking, researching, but also to be compassionate and caring individual.

The IB learner profile is summarized in the following:

As humanity is at the center of education, so is integrity. To maintain a culture of fairness, respect, and honesty, the IB Mission Statement and Learner Profile are key components to model and live by, therefore resulting in responsible citizens.

Admissions to the JM IB Diploma Program

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB DP) is a program that spans over the two last years of school (Second and Third Secondary/ Grades 11 and 12) and aims at developing the learner's skills to meet the characteristics of the IB learner profile.

To be admitted in this program, specific criteria including academic performance, oral skills, open-mindedness, and a full application file are required.

Below are the requirements for a Jesus & Mary student to be admitted in IB DP1:

1- Language Proficiency

- a- English can be chosen as High Levels (HL) or as Standard Level (SL). A minimum of 13/20 is required for HL and of 12/20 for SL calculated over three years (Grades 8, 9, 10/First Secondary).
- b- Arabic is a prerequisite unless the student is holder of a foreign passport/citizenship. It is also calculated over three years from Grade 8 to 10/First Secondary.

2- Academic Performance and Profile

- a- Seriousness, open-mindedness, critical thinking, and knowledge are important norms to be enrolled in IB DP.
- b- A general average of 12/20 calculated over three years, a 13/20 for HL subject matters, and 12/20 for SL are a must.

3- Interview

- a- The interview with the Admissions Committee that includes the Intermediate and Secondary Division Principals, DP Coordinator, IB English teacher, CAS coordinator, and Career Counselor will assess: coherence, international mindedness, critical thinking, communication, and oral skills.
- b- The interview will also assess the English language oral fluency.

4- Application File to be submitted before end of February

- a- Official Brevet diploma or its equivalent for Lebanese candidates.
- b- Transcripts of the last three years.
- c- Application signed by parents.
- d- Letter of intent.

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e- Recommendation Letters detailing integrity, study habits, research,

activities, community service etc.

f- Settlement of tuition fees.

The same requirements apply also to any candidate coming from another school and wishing to enroll in the JM IB DP1. However, the Admissions Committee will review

the candidate's file and will decide whether or not the candidate is eligible for the IB

program and will specify the Entrance Exams he/she will have to sit for.

As for students with learning and behavioral difficulties, they will be assessed and or

admitted following JM Inclusion Policy. It is to be noted that the school can only cater

at present for mild cases.

After reviewing all files, the Admissions Committee will deliver the results by end of

March.
