Jesus & Mary (JM) School is located in Rabweh, Lebanon – a northern suburb of Beirut. The school was founded in 1965 by the late Archbishop of Antelias, Elias Farah, and run by the Sisters of Jesus & Mary – the English Chapter.

JM is a Lebanese nonprofit Catholic school registered with the Lebanese Ministry of Education (Registration number 171).

It is a trilingual school, English being the first language. Therefore, English is the language of instruction for Math, Economics, and Sciences.

JM provides education from Kindergarten to Third Secondary and follows the Lebanese curriculum. Students sit for the Lebanese Official Brevet and Baccalaureate Examinations (Life Sciences, General Sciences, and Sociology and Economics) at the end of Grades 9 and 3S respectively.

JM also offers the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program (DP) in Second Secondary (DP1) and Third Secondary (DP2). Consequently, DP students sit for the official External Assessment of the International Baccalaureate at the end of DP2.

Following in the footsteps of St Claudine Thévenet (1774 - 1837), the foundress of the Congregation of Jesus & Mary, the goals of the school are to educate:

- Trusting Christians who lead a life inspired by faith, love, and forgiveness.
- Virtuous spouses capable of starting happy families.
- Pioneers who earn a living with dignity and contribute to the development of the church, the society, and the nation.

The IB Philosophy, along with the JM principles, complements the IB Learner Profile by preparing students to become "distinguished communicators, role models in society, and dedicated advocates of justice and peace" (*JM Vision Statement*).

The number of students enrolled in the IB programme is as follows:

- School year 2022-2023: 20 students
- School year 2023- 2024: 47 students
- School year 2024-2025: 49 students

27 out of the 74 students in Grade 12 are currently enrolled in the IB programme as full diploma students.

The first IB cohort achieved a 100% success rate in the May 2024 session.
